ABOUT AMATEUR RADIO



Ham Radio, as it is often called, is a hobby. It is a non-commercial radio communication service whose primary aim is public service, technical training, experimenting with radio electronics, and the leisure communication between private persons. Ham operators are noted for providing emergency communications in the event of a disaster. Ham radio exists in nearly every country and on the same frequencies. This allows amateur radio operators to communicate internationally. In the United States, Amateur Radio is regulated by the Federal Communications Commissions. An amateur operator must hold a valid license issued by the FCC.
